Outcomes

In last week's newsletter, this photo was shared of our children, and I felt it needed to be used again for a very special reason. I am so incredibly proud of the children for their attitude energy and enthusiasm towards their learning. Their hard work has meant that our results across the year are incredible and here are just a few headlines:

Year One Phonic Outcomes

The percentage of children passing the test in 2023 across the country was 80% A staggering 98% of our Year One children passed the test, a huge achievement!

Year Two SATs

85% of children are at the expected standard and above for Maths, in reading 81% are and finally in writing 82% are. These results are well above the national average and we are delighted.

Year Four Multiplication Check

In 2022, we received a letter from the Department for Education congratulating our school on being in the top 1% of the country. We were delighted last year, but this year we are celebrating again with 83% of pupils passing the test. The national average for 2023 is 31%.

Year Six SATs

The children have worked so incredibly hard and 93% of children have achieved the expected standard or greater in reading, writing and Maths. The national average is 59%

100% of our children met the expected standard in reading when only 73% of children nationally did.

40% of children achieved greater depth in reading and Maths, whilst in Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar 47% of our Year Six achieved greater depth.

We are so proud of the children's achievements, especially in comparison to the national picture.

Whilst our children are amazing, it couldn't all happen with the committed team that we have across the school. Their boundless energy, enthusiasm and support for each and every child makes Pineham Barns a special place to learn. They go above and beyond, and work so hard to ensure that the children have exceptional learning opportunities. I would like to thank them all for their efforts this year.

Finally, a huge thank you to you, our parents. We are incredibly appreciative of the support that you have given us over the year.
